## **Capital District Transportation Authority**

And its subsidiaries (as reflected in the records of the NY Department of State)

The Capital District Transportation Authority is a public benefit corporation created by Chapter 460 of the laws of 1970, effective August 1, 1970, and embodied in Title 11-C of the NY Public Authorities Law (sections 1300 through 1323). The Authority performs "an essential governmental function" and is created for the stated (section 1304) purpose of "the continuance, further development and improvement of transportation and other services related thereto within the Capital District transportation district, by railroad, omnibus, marine and air."

The Authority is exempt from taxation by statute (section 1316). CDTA is not a non-profit, but rather a public authority with the functions, powers, and responsibilities set forth in the chartering and enabling legislation. CDTA operates with a federal tax ID or Employer Identification Number (EIN) of 14-1515330. CDTA further has the special power; under section 1307(5) to create its own subsidiary corporations that may or may not be public benefit subsidiaries (with the same powers and immunities). The directors and members of subsidiaries are required, by law, to have the same directors and members as the Authority. The Authority may, as allowed by law, transfer any assets to or from subsidiaries. Employees of subsidiaries are NOT deemed to be employees of the Authority. Each public benefit subsidiary is a body politic and corporate and has all of the powers vested in the Authority.

The Authority purportedly owns all vehicles in the revenue fleet, facilities at 110 Watervliet Ave., in Albany, Maxon Road Extension, in Schenectady, and Hoosick Street, in Troy. CDTA has also chosen to create five subsidiaries. The Secretary of State documents their existence, as follows:
